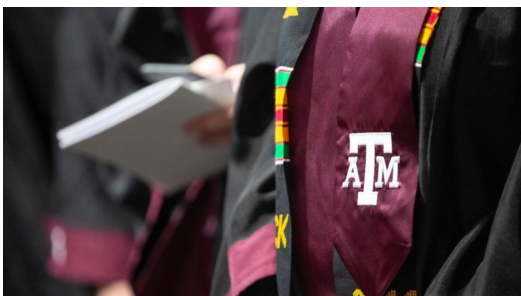


Last general meeting scheduled for May 16

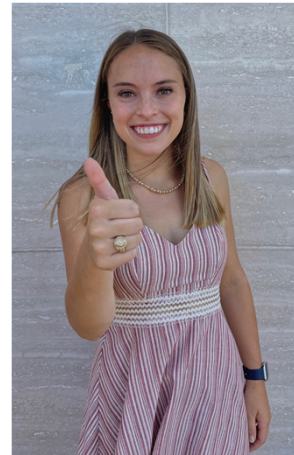
Eight current students received a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.

After graduation, Joshua hopes to pursue a career in data sciences or software development in an environment where he can maintain his core values of service and compassion.

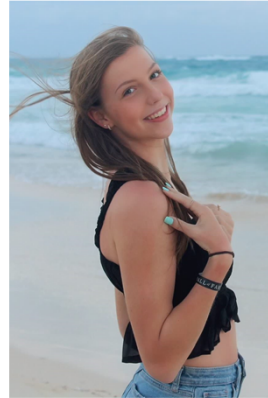


MADDIE BIRD '25

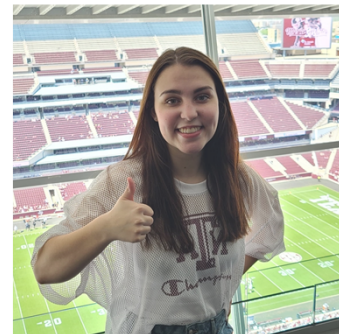


KATIE BROYLES '23

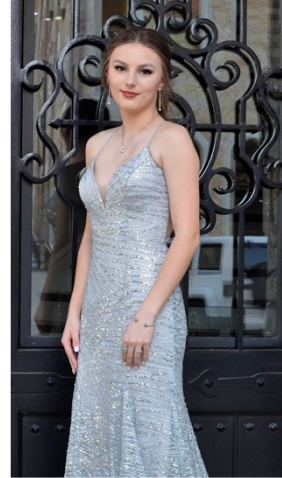


OLIVIA VOGT '26

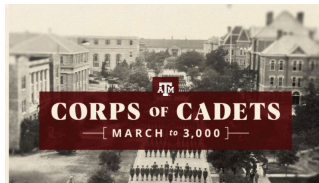
